Candidates applying under Early Decision and Early Action must submit transcripts showing coursework through the junior year and listing senior courses in progress.

Candidates applying under Regular admission must submit transcripts showing coursework through the first semester or trimester of the senior year.

All candidates for admission to St. Olaf College are required to submit two letters of recommendation from teachers who have taught them in an academic subject (English, Foreign Language, History/Social Studies, Mathematics, Natural Science), **preferably in grades 10–12.** For students planning to major in music, one of the two required recommendations may be from a music teacher or conductor. If you are unsure from whom to request a recommendation, please contact the Admissions Office, and an Admissions counselor will provide you with more information. Additional letters from coaches, music conductors (band, choir, orchestra) and pastors or other worship leaders are welcome but do not replace the required academic recommendations.
