1. APPLY FOR ADMISSION TO EMMANUEL COLLEGE

All students must be accepted for admission to the college before any funds can be awarded.

2. COMPLETE THE EMMANUEL COLLEGE FINANCIAL AID APPLICATION (ECAFA)

For each year of attendance, this application must be received by May 1 to be included in the priority group.

3. COMPLETE AND MAIL THE FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA)

This form can be obtained from a high school guidance counselor's office, the Admissions Office and the Financial Aid Office. If you are eligible to file the Renewal Free Application for Federal Student Aid, you are encouraged to do so. You can file your FAFSA over the Internet at **www.fafsa.gov**.

Completing the FAFSA is a crucial step in applying for aid—funds cannot be awarded without it. The information reported must be accurate and is subject to verification.

Remember to:

- Complete ALL items carefully
- Obtain all the necessary signatures
- Indicate Emmanuel College as the school you want to receive your information. Emmanuel's Federal School Code is 001563. **This information must be received at Emmanuel College to be included in the priority group.**
- Mail this application to Emmanuel College

4. FINANCIAL AID TRANSCRIPTS FOR FIRST-TIME TRANSFER STUDENTS

If you have attended another college within the last year prior to transferring to Emmanuel College, you are required to submit a Financial Aid Transcript even if financial aid was not received at the previous school.

5. COLLEGE RECEIVES THE RESULTS OF THE FAFSA

The college will receive an Institutional Student Information Record (ISIR). Once the ISIR is received, additional items may be requested, such as tax records. You will receive a Student Aid Report (SAR). **Please do not make any corrections to your SAR until you have contacted the Financial Aid Office at Emmanuel College.**

6. AWARD LETTER FROM EMMANUEL MUST BE RETURNED WITHIN THREE WEEKS OF RECEIPT

When the financial aid file is completed, the Financial Aid Office awards individual student aid packages based on the demonstrated financial need. The student is sent an award letter, **which must be returned to the Financial Aid Office with the student's signature (accepting or rejecting the award) within three weeks of receipt.** Acceptance of an award does not obligate you to attend EC. However, it does reserve the awarded funds for you, should you decide to enroll.

7. STAFFORD PROMISSORY NOTES MUST BE SUBMITTED TO THE FINANCIAL AID OFFICE

Federal Stafford (Student) Loan promissory notes can be obtained from the Financial Aid Office or obtained directly from your lender if you choose to use a lender other than the college's preferred lender. If you already have a completed Master Promissory Note (MPN) on file at Emmanuel College you do not need to complete any additional paperwork. If you are borrowing under the Federal Stafford Loan Program for the first time at Emmanuel College, you will be required to complete a student loan counseling session. This counseling session must be completed before any promissory notes will be processed.

NOTE: Students meeting the May 1 deadline will be given first priority in the awarding of all financial aid programs. After the May 1 deadline, students will be awarded subject to availability of funds.
