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APPLICATION FEE	There is no admission fee.
APPLICATION DEADLINES	Due to limitations of staff and facilities, Purdue University North Central may not be able to accommodate all qualified applicants in particular curricula. The University reserves the right to close admission to any program as it is filled, and admission to certain programs may close without advance notice. Applications should be completed and submitted 30 days prior to the start of any given semester. There is no assurance that applications received beyond the 30-day guideline can be processed.
FINANCIAL AID	Non-degree students are not eligible for financial aid.
ACADEMIC PROGRESS	Non-degree students must meet the same minimum grade index required of regular students.
SEMESTER LOAD	A high school non-degree student is normally limited to enrolling in a maximum of seven hours per semester during the fall and spring semesters.
COURSE AVAILABILITY	A department may limit the number of non-degree students acceptable in any course.

HOW TO REGISTER FOR CLASSES	When the application is approved, the Office of Admissions will inform students of the name and telephone number of their academic advisor. The academic advisor will assist the students with selection of courses. Students should call their academic advisor for an appointment. NOTE: APPROVAL FOR ADMISSION IS FOR ONE SEMESTER ONLY. STUDENTS MUST SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION TO ENROLL IN ANY SUBSEQUENT SEMESTER.
DOCUMENTS	Transcripts of high school and college work must be submitted prior to advance registration of the subsequent semester.
NONDISCRIMINATION	Purdue University North Central is an equal access/equal opportunity university. No qualified person will be denied admission or employment, nor will any student or employee be subjected to discriminatory treatment or be excluded from participation in any educational program or activity on the basis of race, religion, color, sex, age, national origin, disability, or status as a disabled Vietnam era veteran.
SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER	The social security number is requested as the best and most effective way to uniquely identify you for the purpose of accurately processing and maintaining your educational records. This number will be used as a student identification number and is restricted to internal University use: for example, matching admission applications with SAT or GRE scores, matching admission status with financial aid, obtaining transcripts during and after graduation. If you do not want the University to use your social security number as your student identification number, you will not be penalized. Also, you may request the University to discontinue the use of your social security number as your identification number and purge its records of that number at any time in the future. In either case, the University will then assign another number to you. Your student identification number, whether your social security number or University assigned number, must be used for all subsequent educational record inquiries and processing.
RECORDS	All records submitted by and on behalf of an applicant become the property of Purdue University.
RESIDENCE	Purdue University reserves the right to request documentary evidence in support of a residence claim.


