- SOCIAL AND APPLIED SCIENCES (Economics, Education, Family and Social Service, Management Studies, Nursing, Physical Education, Political Science, Social Studies Education, Social Work, Sociology/Anthropology, Statistics)
- □ THE CENTER FOR INTEGRATIVE STUDIES enables students to pursue individualized, interdisciplinary programs of learning, special majors that they create themselves by integrating courses from within the St. Olaf curriculum with internships, other experiential learning and a senior project.
- AMERICAN CONVERSATIONS is a five-semester program that studies the conversations that have shaped the history and culture of the United States. Together, members of this program focus on questions of American identity and freedom. The program includes four courses and a sophomore Interim that fulfill a number of the college's general education requirements.
- ASIAN CONVERSATIONS is an interdisciplinary way to begin a liberal arts education. Participants study Chinese or Japanese while exploring the cultures of Asia in foundational liberal arts courses. They complete college requirements by exploring the cultures and languages of Asia on campus and on international programs.
- □ THE GREAT CONVERSATION is a sequence of courses which introduces the major epochs of Western civilization through direct encounter with great works of human achievement. Beginning with the study of the ancient Greeks and Hebrews, the program traces the evolution of literacy and artistic expression, philosophic thought, religious belief, and the sciences of human behavior into the modern world.
- □ FIRST CONVERSATIONS offers an integrated approach to the two required courses of the first year at St. Olaf, Religion 121 and General Education 111 (or the "First-Year Seminar"). For each pair of courses included in First Conversations, the participating instructors develop a common approach to the chosen theme, planning sequences of readings and assignments to be carried out over the course of the entire year.
